
Enjoy the dry weather this weekend, get out and about in the fresh air together, kick up the leaves.



A damp and drizzly Monday afternoon was the backdrop for our match against TJ. We started the game well and within 1 minute we had scored due to a powerful Harry A run and finish. A first half scattered with goals meant that we went into half time with a 5-0 lead. Another strong half from the team meant that we ended the game with an 11-0 victory. If I'm totally honest, I can't quite remember who scored when but I know that our 11 goals were scored by Leo H (2), Arlo T (4), Harry A (3) and first Stratford Primary goals for Euan M and Josh M. A good performance from the whole team to take into Wednesday's game.

Stratford Primary 2 - Alveston Primary 1

A sunnier Wednesday at the Paddock meant that the ever-present and vocal parental support were happier, with both the weather and the team's performance. The game had a quick tempo throughout and we were piecing together some lovely passing moves but couldn't find the killer ball in the final third. We had lots of possession but Alveston were very threatening on the counter. Midway through the first half, a stereotypical Arlo T run resulted in his 17th goal in only 6 matches. With our nerves settled, we moved the ball around the pitch with purpose and were unlucky not to score more. Our second goal came from Leo H, who chased down the Alveston defence with great tenacity and poached the ball from the toes of their defender, before slamming the ball home into the side netting.
