

South Petherwin Sports Premium 2015/16

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding, provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture and Sport, will be allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Sports Premium Grant 2015/16

Funding for schools is calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11) as at the annual census in January. All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil.

Total number of primary aged pupils between the ages of 5-11 (January 2015): 105.

Total amount of Sport Premium Grant received: £8,525 (£8000 + £5 per pupil)
