

Home Learning in Year One!

Home Learning. Well done again Year One children and parents! We had lots of fabulous home learning completed again last term and were thrilled by the effort you all put in. This will really support the work we are doing in class. Please choose at least 3 out of the 6 activities/tasks below. We will really treasure your work again so send it in as soon as you complete it and we will display it on a special wall in the classroom and share it with your friends. (Please see the class teacher if you need any help with these activities.)

Geography/Science

Go for a walk in your garden or to a local garden centre - what can you see? Point out geographical features. Which plants can you name? Draw a picture or take a photo of your garden **Challenge:** Can you find your house and garden on 'Google Maps'?

Science/English/Maths

Growing. Can you plant a seed in a tray/pot or in the ground and look after it? How could you measure its growth?

Challenge: Can you write a set of instructions for planting a seed? Can you use sequencing words? (first, next, then, after, finally)

You could draw pictures or take photos.

PSHE

Think about ways of keeping healthy. Make a diary over a week showing ways in which you have been keeping healthy eg, healthy snacks/meals, exercise, bedtimes / hours of sleep etc

Technology

Can you design / make your own garden plant? Think about how you are going to join the different parts - glue / sellotape / split pin / staple.

Challenge: can you make a simple moving mechanism on your plant eg, hinged leaf.

PE

Practise your ball skills - using your feet to control/stop/send/receive a ball, throwing and catching. **Challenge:** Can you design a game for you and your friend / family to play?

Art / Computing / Science

Draw a picture of a garden plant. Think about the use of colour, pattern and texture.

With an adult, use the Internet to look at some pictures of plants by the artist Georgia O'Keefe.

Challenge: can you label the different features? (leaf, stem, roots, petals)
