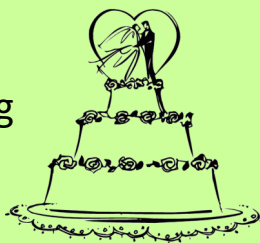

Children are invited to Go-Ride cycle races at Westfield Primary School Somer Valley Cycling Club (SVCC), children aged 7-11 (Years 4 to 6) to a morning of free cycle coaching and fun racing at **Westfield Primary School on Saturday, 19th May 2018.**
