We welcome those who come to our school.</p> <p><b>Forgiveness &amp; Mercy</b> We understand that people can make mistakes. We can say sorry and be friends with each other.</p> <p><b>Peace &amp; Tolerance</b> We work well together and support each other in our work and play. We celebrate our similarities and differences.</p> <p><b>Holiness &amp; Purity</b> We value time spent in prayer and reflection. We respect the faith and beliefs of all who are part of our school community.</p> <p><b>Compassion &amp; Dignity</b> We care for others in our words and our actions. We help others in difficulty.</p> <p><b>Justice &amp; Truth</b> We always tell the truth and help those who might be treated unfairly.</p> <p><b>Integrity &amp; Faithfulness</b> We value our friendships and relationships with each other by being considerate and thoughtful in our actions.</p> <p><b>Service &amp; Sacrifice</b> We work hard in everything we do and are happy to give our time to help others.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Refusing to work</li> <li>• Misusing/hiding school equipment</li> <li>• Negative comments made to others</li> <li>• Interrupting children/teacher</li> <li>• Distracting children/teacher</li> <li>• Not lining up quickly and quietly in the playground</li> <li>• Not responding to an adult request or instruction</li> <li>• Inappropriate attitude when visiting another class</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Repeatedly refusing to work</li> <li>• Running in the school building</li> <li>• Dropping litter in the school or playground</li> <li>• Making negative comments about another child's work</li> <li>• Poor sportsmanship</li> <li>• Bad language (isolated incident)</li> <li>• Bad manners in the dining hall</li> <li>• Answering back in a disrespectful manner</li> <li>• Telling Lies (Isolated incident)</li> <li>• 'Winding-up' another child.</li> <li>• Deliberate minor physical harm (e.g. kicking/pushing)</li> <li>• Refusing to respond to an adult request or instruction</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bullying</li> <li>• Cyber-bullying</li> <li>• Stealing</li> <li>• Persistent Lying</li> <li>• Verbal Abuse</li> <li>• Persistently refusing to work</li> <li>• Telling lies that implicate others</li> <li>• Serious physical harm to others</li> <li>• Bad language (repeated incidents)</li> <li>• Deliberate maltreatment of resources</li> <li>• Inappropriate use of school ICT equipment</li> <li>• Making inappropriate comments about someone's race, culture, religion or gender</li> <li>• Disturbing others during class prayer time, assemblies and mass</li> <li>• Refusing to say sorry for unacceptable behaviour</li> </ul>
<p><b>What are the consequences of unexpected behaviour?</b></p>	<p>The teacher or adult can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Give you a warning</li> <li>• Put your name on the behaviour chart in the classroom</li> </ul>	<p>The teacher or adult will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Put your name on the classroom behaviour chart</li> <li>• Write your name in the behaviour book.</li> </ul>	<p>The teacher or adult will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Send you to see Mrs Jackson or Mr Bath.</li> <li>• Write your name in the behaviour book.</li> <li>• Speak to or contact your parents</li> </ul> <p>You may be asked to work in another classroom</p>
