Rationale for Learning

This term we will taking the children on an exciting learning journey around the world with our travelling circus. They will learn about different circus performers and their skills. Suggested activities for families to help support learning

Please continue to read daily with your child.

Counting past 100 forwards and backwards to and from any number; counting in 2s, 5s and 10s; telling the time (o' clock and half past); weighing and measuring

Maths - addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, equals, fraction, more, less
