Create your very own sea creature, real or imaginary. Does it have a special feature? Be creative!	Write a letter to the Prime minister about the importance of recycling and the impact of plastic pollution.	Find out who Sir David Attenborough is and create a fact file on him.	Invent a machine that helps to reduce plastic wastage. You could draw this, or design and build it yourself!
Design and build an underwater vehicle that could be used to explore the hidden depths.	Write a short story about the dream of a plastic free world	Research some of the world's most endangered species and the reasons for their drop in numbers.	Think of a solution to using carrier bags. We use hundreds of thousand every day, how else could we do our shopping and get it all home easily?
Create a picture of a beach scene out of recycled materials.	What do you think the future of recycling looks like? Think about some changes that are already being made and explain your ideas.	Create a leaflet on pollution in the oceans and how we can help.	Make your very own sea themed board game!
Design an underwater/beach scene or a Rainforest Scene using shoe boxes as a frame.	Write an a-z of sea creatures. Find one sea creature for every letter. For example A for anemone, B for Barracuda...etc.	Research an extinct sea creature. This could date back to the dinosaurs! Draw and label the creature.	Make a mural/mosaic using bottle tops from milk cartons and drink bottles. This can be any theme you like!
Create a sea creature in a bottle. Some good ideas are jellyfish or an octopus! Try using some hair gel mixed with water and glitter!	A list of reasons that we need trees for and why they are so important.	Research a famous environmental activist and what they are doing to help the environment. For example The Ian Somerhalder Foundation.	A review of one of David Attenborough's documentaries. For example Planet Earth. Which episode did you watch, and what information did it give you?
