
Can you guess these songs that begin with 't'?




<p>Monday</p>	<p>We use the phonics Read Write Inc (RWI) to introduce children to letters and sounds at BBeebies.</p> <p>Here you can find their parent guide and lots of free resources to support your child's learning. Parent guide to Read Write Inc. Phonics Oxford Owl</p> <p>This week we are learning the letter and sound 't' It's a bouncy sound, can you practise saying t-t-t? When we write it we think of a tall tower and say, "Down the tower, across the tower."</p> <p>Using your finger, can you practise writing this sound on the picture? In the air? On the floor? <p>Tuesday</p>	<p>Practise recognising and saying this letter sound. What begins with a 't'? Table! Can you find any objects around your house that begin with a 't' and put them on your table? Take a photo or draw what you've found. I would really love to see them!</p> <p>Counting confidently to 10. Can you collect objects, place them in a line and count them using one to one correspondence? Take a video to show me! Why don't you try this?
