## PE Premium Report – Bishop Bronescombe

**The funding stated below will be received during the period stated above during the grant period of 2015/2016.**

### Purpose of the grant

This funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2015 to 2016 academic year so that they develop healthy lifestyles.

### Basis of allocation

Allocations for the academic year 2015/16 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6, and those age 5 in Year R, as recorded on January 2015 Census (referred to as “eligible pupils” below), as follows:

- Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 plus £5 per eligible pupil.

It brought together children, teachers and parents from different schools to create a sporting success. All the students showed great spirit and camaraderie, and gave their best performances throughout the course of this event, regardless of their results. This event was a major factor in breaking the barrier for many children previously unable or not wanting to participate in physical activity. The MAT Olympics, not only served as a tool for the children to participate in sporting activity but also enhanced their attitudes towards long-term and sustainable physical activity. External providers, Cornish cricket club, £9 minibus hire and 27.60 St Johns ambulance for MAT Olympics. £62.50 sports coaches on 25 <sup>th</sup> May 2016.	4319.10	<p><b>Lunchtime Club</b> Our coach from the Cornish cricket club, offered a range of sporting activities which encouraged children to partake in sports that they may not have tried before / enhance their skill set for a range of sports.</p> <p>The increase in sporting activities during lunchtimes meant a larger participation rate of children being able to access physical activities outside of the curriculum time.</p> <p>Due to increased PE participation this means pupils fitness levels are improving.</p> <p><b>G&amp;T/Team sessions/after school club</b> G&amp;T children skills have been extended in a wide range of sports. There has been good success at Mid-Cornwall competitions this year and at county level. Year 4, have developed to be exceptionally strong. We qualified for the School Games final for golf and came 2nd in Cornwall for Y3/4 sports hall athletics.</p> <p><b>PE lessons</b> Through pupil conferencing and observation of PE, the coordinator identified improved engagement and enthusiasm by the majority of pupils.</p>
