<p>Our Place in the World</p> 	<p>Creating our healthy fruit kebabs will enable us to discuss the importance of eating healthily and how a good diet will positively impact both our brains and bodies. Through our RE topic, we will investigate the importance of religion and bible stories in the Christian community</p>	<p>We will focus on Britain in contrast to Australia – its physical and human made features and how they compare. We will look at weather patterns and find out how they change from place to place.</p>	<p>We will discuss how the events of the Great Fire of London have shaped the Great British fire service today. We will look at how architecture and building was changed after the fire to make it more sustainable.</p>
<p>Inspired Learners</p> 	<p>Through a variety of physical workshop the children will begin to develop their understanding of the importance of exercise. They will be inspired to choose healthy options by being provided with fruit and veg selections that they may not normally try!</p>	<p>An exciting flight to Australia will encourage the children to think about our planet and how far over countries are from us. Our Australian instrument production will allow the children to express themselves musically through instruments that they may not be familiar with.</p>	<p>A visit from a fire-fighter will inspire us to think of important fire safety questions. This will develop our curious questioning skills. We will look at fire evacuation plans and think about how they are designed to keep us safe.</p>

Through a variety of cooking activities, we will experiment with taste over cost and how farmers ensure quality in our food.
