Science	Understanding the World	Letter Sounds of the Week	Notes
<p>Colour mixing.</p> <p>The children will have the chance to experiment with paint, chalks and food colouring in water to mix colours together to make new ones.</p> <p><i>At home: Have a go at this experiment at home with your children.</i></p>	<p>The children are going to be learning about different textures and the vocabulary that they can use to describe what they are touching. We will ask the children how they feel about the different textures and look for a range of textures in the classroom and garden.</p> <p><i>At home: Are there certain textures that your child likes and dislikes? What different textures can you find in your home, gardens, local park etc?</i></p>	<p>We are introducing phonics to the children using Ruth Miskin cards. These will be displayed in your child's classroom for you to look at. This week's sounds are:</p> <p>x – down the arm and leg, repeat the other side</p> <p>y – down a horn, up a horn and under the head</p> <p>z – zig, zag, zig</p> <p><i>At home: look out for these letters in the books you share with your child. Practice saying the sounds these letters make. <p>A simple repeating pattern.</p> <p>The children will be learning how to make a simple repeating pattern, with two components, using equipment that is familiar to them such as the pegs and peg boards. We will challenge them to make more complicated repeating patterns and listen to repeated sound patterns and look at repeated action patterns.</p> <p>Numbers of the week 13 & 14</p>	<p>We will be playing a simple game of 'spot the difference'.</p> <p>This is a great game to get the children to look closely at details and be able to talk about the differences that they can see.</p> <p><i>At home: Play this game with your children at home with pictures and real life objects.
