



Homework update

All homework will be sent out on a Tuesday and will need to be returned on either Friday or Monday. There was a split of parents wanting homework to be in before the weekend, whilst others wanted homework to be handed in after the weekend. As there was no consensus we have decided to leave it up to parents to decide when they send their child's homework in, however, all homework will need to be return by **Monday** at the latest.

Home will be marked by the class teachers, this will be in the form of ticking and initialing the work.

All pupils will be issued with a homework book, all work will need to be completed in the book and the book returned to school.
