



Evidencing impact of Primary PE and Sport Premium

The information below is reflective of how Boringdon Primary School will spend the Primary PE and Sport Premium awarded in the academic year 2017/18.

The key areas that we have identified are based on the following vision and objectives set by the Government.

Department for Education Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium

All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

Objective

To achieve self-sustained improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision that will live beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

We have used the key indicators set by the Government to inform our decision on how to spend the funding and help us to assess the impact on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment;

- 5. Increase participation in competitive sport.*
