7. My pencil is 12cm long. My ruler is 17cms more than the pencil. How long is the ruler?

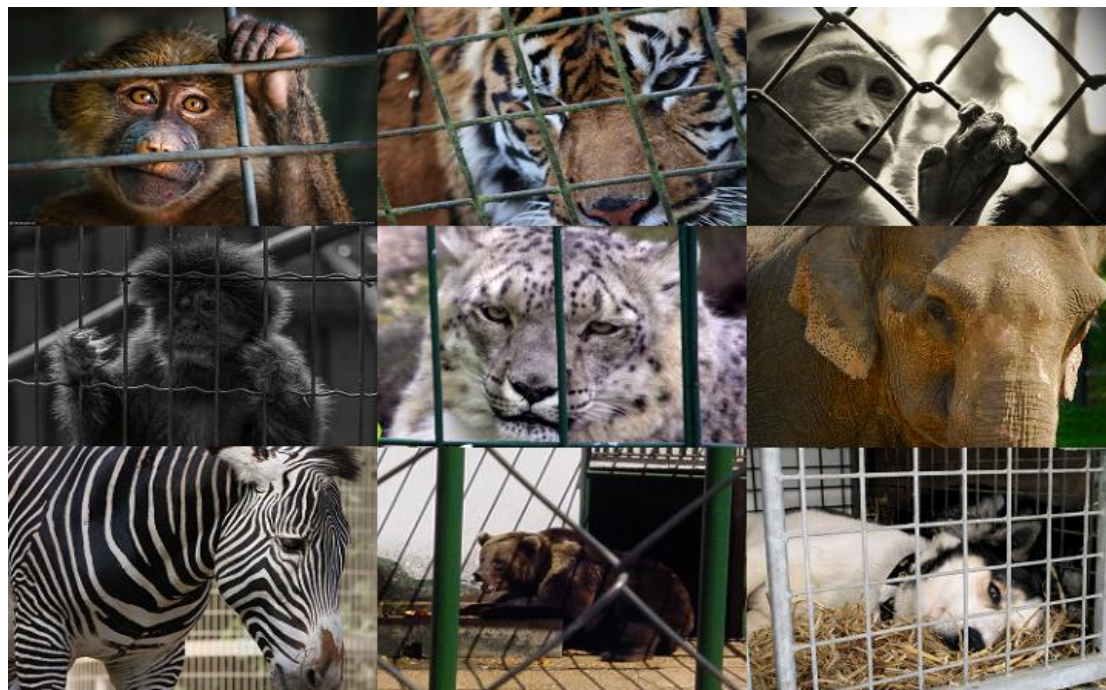


8. The green ribbon is 23cm long. The yellow ribbon is 12cm shorter than the green ribbon. How long is the yellow ribbon?

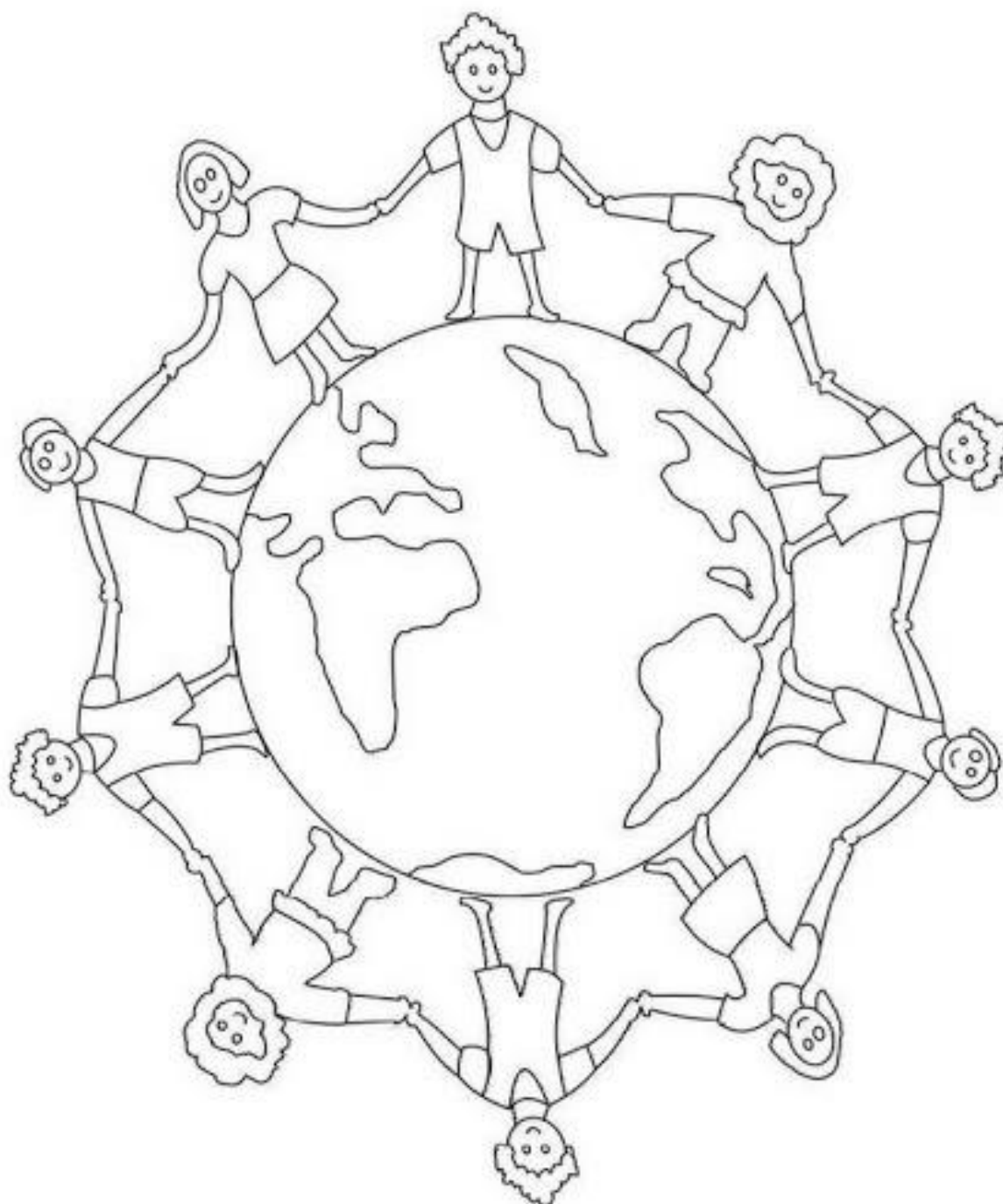


## RE: We are all God's Children.

# Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Every January we celebrate the life of a great man. Martin Luther King, Junior fought for civil rights. He believed all Americans should be treated fairly, no matter what their skin color.



Dr. King was born in 1929 in Georgia. Since he was black, he could not go to the same schools as white children. Black Americans also had to use separate restrooms, restaurants, theaters, and swimming pools in some states.

Dr. King thought this was wrong. He was a Christian minister who worked for equal rights for black people. He helped lead peaceful protests to change those unfair laws.

It was a hard fight. Dr. King was attacked and arrested many times. But more and more Americans grew to understand that it was wrong to treat black people differently from white people.

In 1963, Dr. King led a quarter million people in a march to Washington, D.C. While there, Dr. King gave his famous "I Have a Dream" speech. He spoke about his hopes for America. He said people should be judged by their hearts, not by their skin color. His efforts helped bring about new laws to create equal rights for all Americans.

The third Monday of January is a holiday to celebrate the life of Martin Luther King. We honor his courage in working to improve the lives of so many people.

## Sentence types.

**Statements** - Statements are sentences which tell you something. They are usually a fact or an opinion. They end with a full stop. (.)

**Questions** - Questions are sentences that ask you something. They expect an answer or a response so you can get more information. They usually end with a question mark. (?) They usually start with who, what, where, when, why or how but sometimes have other options such as 'Did you...', 'Can you...'

**Commands** - Commands are sentences that tell you to do something - they are an order or instruction. They are often urgent or angry and can be very short. They usually start with an imperative verb - bossy verb/action word such as 'sit down', 'come here', 'listen to me!'

**Exclamations** - Exclamations are sentences that begin with 'how' or 'what'. They tell us how you feel. They include a verb and end with an exclamation mark. An exclamation mark comes at the end (!)
