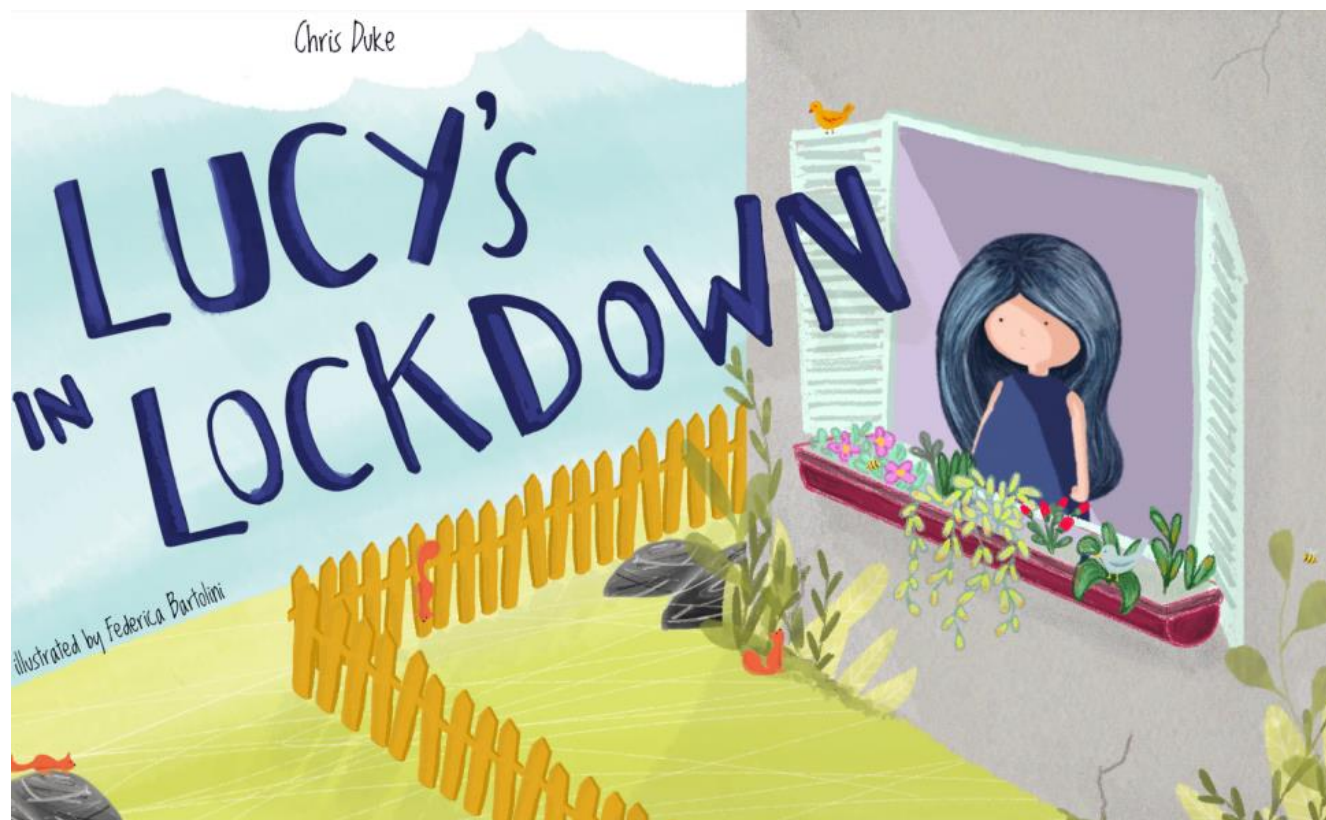

Everyone's home, in the whole entire land.



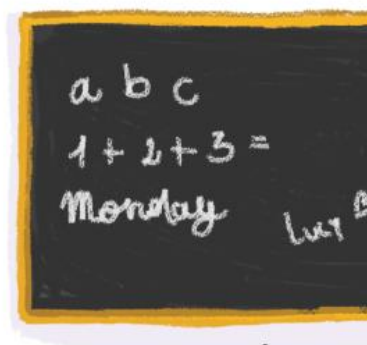
She has to stay home,

He noticed the change to red in her hair.



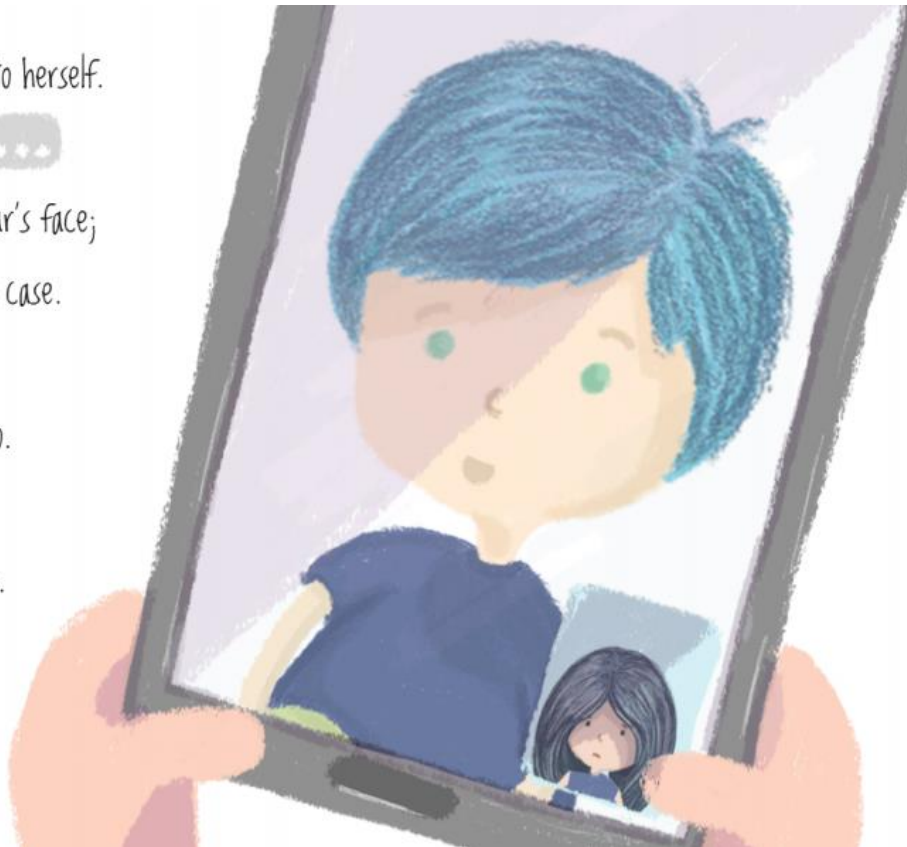
She looks out and sees the postie go by;

And please don't forget what I always say:

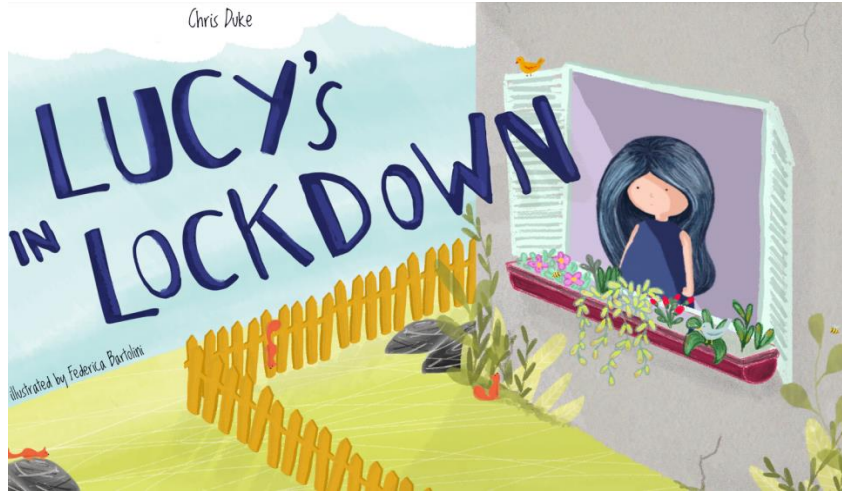

Writing: Commas in a list: making a potion

Commas are used to separate words in a list. Commas cannot come before or after the word; 'and'. Commas are used instead of writing 'and' too many times!

Commas sit on the line.



Commas are used to make a list of items or things:

I went to the shop to buy cake, sweets, bread and milk.

Instead of saying:

I went to the shop to buy cake and sweets and bread and milk.



A witch needs to add lots of items into her cauldron to make a potion.

Read through her lists and add commas:

1. The 'invisibility' potion needs a spider glitter salt and some hair from a wizard's beard.
2. The 'wishing' potion needs sprinkles worms and toad's breath.
3. The 'flying' potion needs a feather sugar fairy dust and a bird's tail.

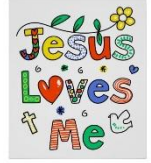
4. The 'swimming' potion needs 2 gills water seaweed and shells.
5. The 'calming' potion needs candles blankets and teddy bears.
6. The 'love' potion needs kindness hugs kisses smiles and laughter.
