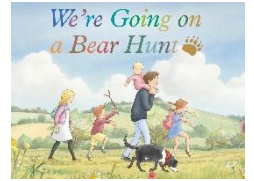


We're going on a bear hunt.

Who are they hunting for?

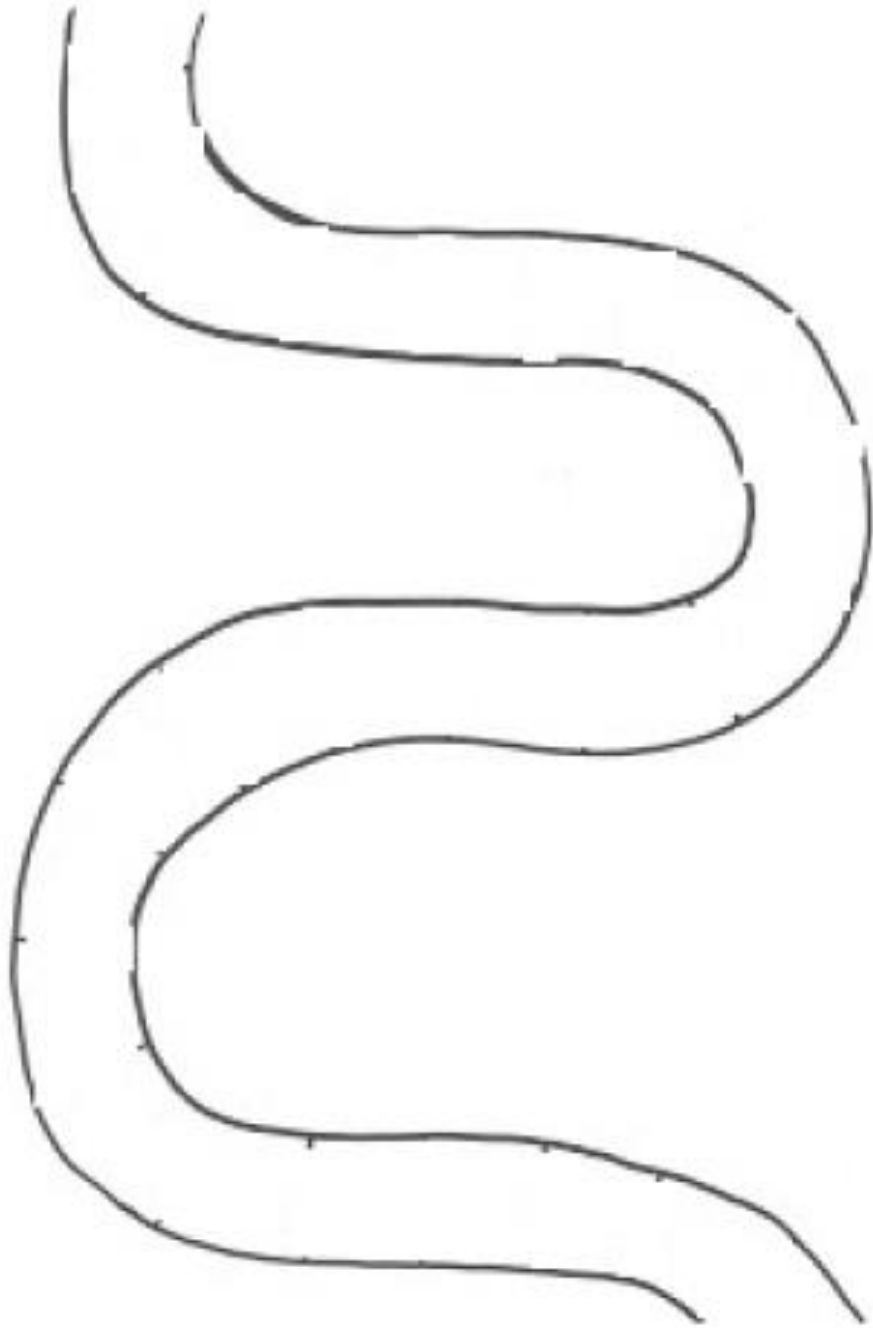
What will they find? What will the creature be and look like?
