## **Change to Year 5/6 Entry and Exit from School**

After a review of our before and after school procedures, we have decided to change the way Year 5/6 children come into and leave school.

From Monday 27<sup>th</sup> November, we will open the brown wooden gate at the end of the staff car park for children to come into the Year 5/6 unit. Parents and Carers will be able to talk to teachers at the classroom doors and children will be able to come straight into class and get settled for the day. At the end of the day, children will be dismissed from the classroom doors. We would ask that if you are collecting your child, you wait at the bottom of the steps on the small playground. There will be a TA standing at the gate to ensure the children's safety.

We will also be locking the car park vehicular gates to ensure that there is no traffic movement from 8.40 – 9.00 and from 3.15 – 3.35pm.

We hope that this will encourage a smooth, calm start and end to the day and enable you to speak to your child's class teacher if and when necessary.

Dear Parents/Carers,

Our school has been given the opportunity to take part in a project that will run jointly between schools and Devon and Cornwall Police.

'Operation Encompass' is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has been exposed to, or been involved in, any domestic incident.

'Operation Encompass' will ensure that a member of the school staff, (known as a key Adult), is trained to enable them to liaise with the Police. Relevant information gained will be shared with the police in confidence and the school will be able to make provision for any possible difficulties experienced by children or their families who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.

### Foundation

This week we have continued to look at the book 'Oh No George'. We have had a go at writing a sorry letter to Harris his owner. Miss Mogford and Mrs Mogford kindly allowed Brave, a puppy, to visit the children this week. We thought of questions that we wanted to ask and then confidently asked them during the visit. We are looking forward to Miss Hayman's dog visiting tomorrow, where we then be able to make comparisons between the two dogs.

We have looked at length and size in Maths this week and talked about how to measure accurately. We have been focusing on developing our mathematical language to show our understanding. We continue to practice our Christmas production. Costume letters and how to get tickets will be sent out by the end of the week.



### Years 1 & 2

Our first performance of 'The Magical Christmas Puzzle' will soon be here and we have been incredibly busy with our singing and acting. We have also been preparing props and would like to borrow any walking sticks that people may have at home. We would kindly ask you to label these so we can return them as soon as possible after the performances. We would also be really appreciative if you have any unwanted pillowcases that we

could have to help us with our prop making. Of course, along with our rehearsing we have been continuing our English, Maths and Theme lessons. Year 2 have just completed their shared write based on the story 'Wanted: The Perfect Pet' and children will be embarking on writing their own individual stories. They will be encouraged to use their knowledge of commas in a list and expanded noun phrases. Year 1 are continuing to explore adjectives and have been writing phrases and sentences to describe the items and costumes Mr Benn picked up during his adventures. During their Maths sessions, Year 2 will be solving worded problems using their knowledge of number facts. Year 1 will be solving a range of addition and subtraction problems and using a variety of visual methods to do this. They will be encouraged to begin thinking about number facts that they already know.

Could we also remind you that if your child has words for our Christmas play, that they have them in school at all times. This will help us to make the most of our rehearsing time.

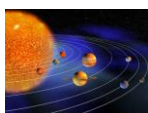


### Years 3 & 4

The displays within the hub are now being updated to include the children's most recent stories. Please have a look at them during the open afternoon. The children and staff are proud of the progress they are making.

During Theme, the children are becoming more confident in their understanding of aspects of sound/light. They are practising sharing their knowledge by explaining to others, writing their ideas or completing diagrams.

Our new Maths topic is multiplication and the children are learning about arrays and their link to multiplication. During the week we would like them to be 'Going on an array hunt!' When they are out at the shops with you, or at the library or sports centre, etc, see if they can spot an array. Please see examples below. If possible, take a photo for the class display, or draw a picture to show what it looked like, or even describe it with sentences. Many thanks



### Years 5 & 6

Year 5 /6 have completed their newspapers. The improvement in writing was fantastic - come and have a look at your child's writing window to see how much progress they have made in handwriting, sentence openers, punctuation and conjunctions. Year 6 will be publishing 'Willowbank Express' full of stories about Willowbank this half term. If you would like to have a copy, we will be collecting donations that will support the extra funding of the trip to @Bristol in December.

In Maths, Year 5 children have been learning about square and cube numbers; Year 6 children have been developing their division skills. We are really working hard on linking strategies to a visual

image and being able to explain our maths using technical vocabulary. Times tables are improving across the unit - well done for all the practice! Keep going!

Theme this week was based around the key question: What is Light? We learnt about light sources, that light travels in straight lines and those angles of incidence are equal to angles of reflection. We practised using a protractor and measuring angles. We also developed our science investigation skills by thinking about the need to repeat results and developed our construction of bar charts to support our conclusions.

The unit has been very active this week. On Wednesday, several children represented us at the Athletics event at CCC. The children participated really well and were great sportsmen and women. Fifteen children represented us on Tuesday singing for a 'Soup and Sweet' afternoon. The feedback was really positive; thank you for being such great Willowbank ambassadors.



#### First absence calls

**If your child is going to be absent from school you must tell us. If you know your child will be absent in advance, please complete an S2 Absence request form or produce an appointment letter or a written note to the office. Currently if we are unaware of the reason for a child's absence we will make a "first absence call", firstly to the parent/carer who the child lives with and then to the other parent (even in circumstances where the parents are separated) If we fail to make contact with either parent, we will then go on to telephone other members of the family, who we have contact details for, to establish the whereabouts of the child. In some cases, a home visit may be carried out. All Devon schools have been notified of a national tragic event -we have a duty to safeguard our children.**

#### After school clubs-Safeguarding your children

In order for us to ensure we are safeguarding your children, we need to know if there is an occasion on which your child is unable to attend an after school club that they have signed up for. Please inform the school office, either in writing or in person. Please do not inform your child's class teacher as due the morning rush messages are often not passed on. Between now and February half term no children will be allowed to walk home alone from an after school club because of the poor light.

We are also aware that there has been concern over the busy end of sessions. This should now be rectified.
