SCIENCE



Our focus for Science will be Forces and Motion, so children will be actively engaged in seeing how these are at work in pushing, pulling and conducting experiments in these areas. We're looking forward to doing this during Science week, beginning 4 May.

ENGLISH



We have started our new topic, Word War II, by reading 'Goodnight Mister Tom.' So far this week the children have participated in role-play sessions, acting out the part of Tom and Willie, when they first meet. Further work will involve exploring the other characters and describing the setting of the story, culminating in the children writing their own narrative in the style of 'Goodnight Mister Tom.' The children are constantly revising, and updating, their SPAG knowledge

RE

We will be looking at 'What Would Jesus Do?' as a key question throughout our RE lessons this week. The class will read stories where Jesus showed love, compassion and forgiveness; and will consider how these teachings can be reflected upon in everyday life.

MATHS

In Maths, children have been looking at division and will start work on other aspects of number, including ratio and proportion. Despite the fact that they won't be sitting SATS this term, Year 6 children will still be doing SATS type questions and all children will be working towards mastery and achieving greater depth.

PE and FOREST SCHOOL

We intend to make use of the lovely weather (we hope!) by continuing with outdoor PE sessions of dodgeball and cricket. Children will continue to have regular Forest School Sessions with Mrs Hazell.

PSHE

Children will be continuing to look at their wellbeing in the aftermath of lockdown. We will also have sessions by the Community Cops who will be looking at Road Safety, Cyber Safety and Anti-Social Behaviour to help increase the sense of self awareness outside of school.
