School Uniform

Please remember that skirts and trousers must be smart school wear. Smart black shoes should be worn, without flashing lights. Children are not allowed to wear trainers, fashion shoes or boots.

In years 3 and 4 children can wear a shirt and tie but this is optional. In years 5 and 6 all children must wear a white shirt or a white blouse, with a school tie.

Children are not allowed to wear jewellery in school or smart watches. Earrings are not allowed to be worn for safety reasons. If you would like to have your child's ears pieced, we therefore suggest this is done at the start of the holiday. If at anytime your child should not remove their earrings, please put it in writing to Mrs Tanner, otherwise staff will request that the children remove them. Hair accessories must be in school colours, yellow or bottle green. Extreme hair cuts or hair gel/cream are not allowed. Hair longer than shoulder length must be tied back.
