

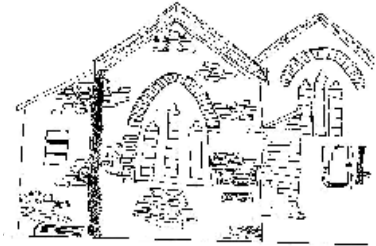

Dear Parents,

The children in Class 1 have had a very busy time this week. In Maths they have been exploring a range of different 3D shapes. They have been learning the names of a variety of 3D shapes as well as the vocabulary used to describe the different properties of these shapes.

In Literacy, the children have been unpicking the nursery rhyme 'There was a Crooked Man', before writing their own version of this nursery rhyme in the same style. Meanwhile, in R.E., the children have been finding out all about the meaning behind the Christingle and the Advent.

This week, Branscombe School has been full of the sounds of singing as the children have been busy learning, and practising, a range of Christmas carols and songs in preparation for next week's Christingle Service, singing at the Branscombe Christmas Fair on Saturday, and also learning songs for the forthcoming Christmas play!

This week, Class 2 have begun a new Design and Technology project, in which they will be looking at different kite designs, and then designing, making and testing their own kites. The project began with a look at the story of Honan Walsh, a sixteen-year-old kite-flyer, who flew his kite across the Niagara Falls in 1847, and thus enabled the building of the Niagara Falls Bridge. Next, the children will look at a range of kite designs. If anyone has any kites that they are able to lend the class, to test and support their investigations, this would be really helpful.

In their French lessons this term, the children are learning different ways to answer the question, "Ou habite-tu?" ("Where do you live?") Over the last couple of lessons, this has involved learning about the names of different types of home, in French - although many of the children needed to consolidate their understanding of the meaning of terms, such as "detached", "semi-detached" and "terraced" in English as well! Next, the children will learn to link this vocabulary with their previous learning of vocabulary, for different types of settlement or location (e.g. town, village, seaside, countryside etc.).

Branoc Hall Christmas Fair

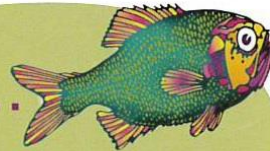

The Story of Jonah

Some folk always seem to be arguing or moaning and groaning. Sometimes they moan about the weather, sometimes they moan about their family, and sometimes they just moan. In fact, they are so busy moaning about EVERYTHING that they forget to be thankful for ANYTHING.

Jonah was just like that! He moaned all the time. So when God asked him to go to Ninevah and tell the people there that he was angry about their stealing, lying, fighting and their wicked ways, of course Jonah moaned and groaned. "Not Ninevah, please! Anywhere but Ninevah! We have never got on with that nasty bunch. Please Lord, send someone else." And just in case God asked him again Jonah, quick as his legs could carry him, ran to the dock and asked the captain of the nearest boat to take him to the furthest place from Ninevah. The nearest boat was the Jolly Dragon and her captain was called Wise Captain Silas. The Jolly Dragon set sail on a calm sea under a clear blue sky but within a day found herself caught up in a fierce and frightening storm. Captain Silas knew immediately that something was not right. Seaton Christmas Lights Switch On

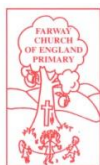
