

Marching Soldiers

Have you ever seen a parade with marching soldiers? Often, they are in very smart lines and rows. Their parades can help us create some arrays! An array is a way of representing a multiplication fact.



There are 8 soldiers in this parade (array). They are organised in two rows and four columns.

$$2 \times 4 = 8$$
