VERY IMPORTANT

The Road Works and Parking around school are particularly challenging at the moment. I have met with the Police and the builders to discuss my concerns and I have attached a letter from Lancashire Constabulary, outlining the Highways Acts and our responsibilities as drivers. My concerns are based on the safety of the children, the wider school family and all other road users.

Lives are being put at risk through:

- Speeding on the roads around school
- Parking/Gathering on pavements without leaving safe passing of pedestrians (eg with prams)
- Parking on Zig Zag lines outside school
- Drivers making 3-Point Turns on Lea Road and Sidgreaves Lane outside school
- Children being dropped off from cars stopped in the middle of the road

A member of the public has written to me expressing concerns, including having seen
"children running free from parents and into the road."
