Parking on Yellow Lines

Thank you to all our families for not parking on the new double yellow lines at the junction of Barewell Road and Shelley Avenue. We do monitor the parking at the start and the end of the school day to help keep the roads safe for the children and there has been a noticeable improvement.

We also respectfully ask Blue Badge users to have due regard for the regulations around parking on double yellow lines. The regulations state you must not park within 15 metres of a junction. They also clearly state that you must not park where it would endanger, inconvenience or obstruct pedestrians or other road users.

This includes:

- school entrances, bus stops, on a bend, near the brow of a hill or hump bridge
- where it would make it difficult for others to see clearly, for example, close to or opposite a junction, except in an authorised parking space
- where the kerb has been lowered or the road raised to help wheelchair users
