Overview

We believe that every child is a gift and every child is gifted. Pupil premium funding is used to challenge barriers faced by vulnerable children and their peers. Our school development plan promotes the personal, social and emotional development of our children and this is where our pupil premium spend is focused.

Outdoor learning, well-being programmes and high quality phonics and maths provision are key drivers in this year's strategy. We discuss pupils' progress and well-being in our pupil development reviews. The holistic needs of children are analysed at least once a term. Interventions or specific focus areas of Quality First Teaching will give additional support to help children make progress.

4) Relationships and Health Education (RHE)	Planning and implementation of quality RHE curriculum / E4S	£150	Statutory RHE enhanced with the safeguarding focus of West Sussex 'Education 4 Safeguarding' should ensure that children have less fear and worry about growing up.	Review well-being termly through Pupil Development Meetings.
5) Phonics and reading	Song of Sounds / Phonics books School library	£600	Targeted phonic activities with decodable books linked to pupils' individual phonics journey. The song is fun and catchy to reinforce sounds. Standards have already risen in phonics since starting this approach.	Phonics/reading progress and outcomes.
6) Maths	Maths Mastery resources and training (TA sessions with maths leader)	£900	All staff trained to use Power Maths, enabling all children to be mathematicians – deep and secure knowledge through immersive activities, number fluency and 'keep up, not catch up' approach that includes whole class with boosted support for individuals as needed.	Maths progress and outcomes.
