### **Pupil Premium 2015-2016**

At Etwall primary school we have identified that there are 24 pupils who qualify for funding. This is below the National average. The funding per pupil is £ 1320 for 2015-2016. The funding total is: £31,680. This is predicted numbers as changes can occur throughout the year.

### **Objectives for Pupil Premium spending:**

At Etwall Primary School we believe that the key principles for pupil premium funding are,

- That it will be used to provide additional academic support to accelerate progress and to raise the standard of achievement for these pupils.

- It will be used to narrow and close the gap between the achievement of these pupils and their peers.
- The funding is also used to enable these pupils to experience a range of extra-curricular activities at a reduced rate or without charge; including after school sports clubs and music tuition.
- Funding can also be used to subsidise costs of school trips so that all pupils can access the benefits of learning beyond the classroom.

The school will use the additional funding to address any underlying inequalities between children eligible for Pupil Premium and others.
