## **Willow Class**

We have been sequencing stories in Year 1 while Year 2 have been watching videos and reading articles on pollution and the impact of too much plastic. This will help them with writing their own articles which is next. Mr Seward kindly visited us last week to talk about his farm and the products they produce. After finding out about how wheat grows and is harvested we enjoyed making bread and eating it!



In maths the children in Year 1 have made clocks and explored time. Year 2 have been revising their use of estimation, multiplication and division.

## **Holly Class**

Holly Class had Professor Snape (Mr Pitt) come and visit them to teach potions. They practised their skills of measuring liquids using scales and had a lot of fun doing it!



In science, the children have evaluated different materials ahead of making sound proofing headphones. They have tested their creations by creating their own investigations.



## **Silver Birch Class**

This week Silver Birch have been solving problems related to money, planning and budgeting. The children have worked hard to plan parties with very specific food requests, spot problems with bills and designed and costed theme parks. In English we have finished our Greek God fact files. We paid careful attention to the final presentation, taking influence from some of our favourite non-fiction texts such as 'Good Night Stories for Rebel Girls'.



We also investigated saturation points and reversible/irreversible reactions in science.

We have been very impressed with how all the children in Year 6 have approached all their tests.
