
A few parents have asked what specific measures we have been able to put in place in school to ensure we are adhering to government guidance during these unprecedented times. There are many safety measures in place including:

- Small class groups
- Classroom furniture rearranged to ensure 2m distancing as much as possible
- Use of the outdoors to maximise lessons outside agreed and timetabled
- Agreed areas of the school which will not be used in order to reduce movement around the school
- Drop-off and collection times staggered and protocols in place to minimise adult to adult contact
- Unnecessary items removed from the classroom and stored
- Soft furnishings and soft toys removed
- Protocols in place to ensure play equipment is cleaned after use
- Handwashing basins nearby and cleaning record in place in each class
- Hand sanitiser available in all classrooms
- Classroom bins are emptied regularly throughout the day
- Spaces are well ventilated
- Additional cleaning in place throughout the day
- PPE equipment available if needed
- Protocol in place to limit the use of shared resources
- Protocols in place should a pupil/adult become ill with Coronavirus symptoms whilst in school

POINTS
