Message from Mrs Grainger

As the Government have now placed Lichfield into Tier 3, the 'very high alert' category we thought it would be useful to issue a few gentle reminders.

- Please stick to your pick up and drop off time.

IT'S DECEMBER! The children and staff are getting really excited for Christmas. This week we have written letters to Santa, cut out and decorated snowflakes, designed our own snowman, painted a snowman, made our own winter small world using different animals, practiced copying patterns in glitter, writing labels, practicing addition, completed winter counting and much more.

This week the children have showed the Early Years staff what they have learnt over the term. They have been writing their name, reading and writing simple words and sentences, counting objects, naming and describing 2D and 3D shapes, finding one more/ less of a number, exploring positional language as well as recognising sounds that we have learnt in Phonics.
