English	Maths	Topic	Motivation
<p>This week's learning will be based on the theme of Black Lives Matter. With all of the recent events going on in the world, it seems a perfectly opportune moment to revisit this important area of learning.</p> <p>One of my favourite role models in the world is Muhammad Ali. I admire him for his brilliance in his chosen sport (boxing), his attitude towards equality, his braveness in standing up for his beliefs and for his kindness and thoughtfulness to others.</p> <p>Watch the video below to find out about him:</p> <p><i>Muhammad Ali Biography (History for Kids) Educational Videos for Students Cartoon Network (CN)</i></p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=avVqLeX9GZQ</p> <p>Once you have watched this, have a go at one of the 3 saved reading comprehensions about my hero. If you scroll through the pdf attached to the class webpage, you will see there are 3 to choose from (from easier to harder). You only need to choose one to do. The last one is the most interesting to read so be brave if you think you can have a go at this. There are answer sheets provided so you can mark the work yourselves to see how you've done!</p> <p>The main task for this week is to create a presentation / poster about a famous black role model. If you would like to continue researching about Muhammad Ali, I've attached a Powerpoint for further reading.</p>	<p>www.whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-5/</p> <p>This week's learning is all about percentages and decimals. These are simply ways, like fractions, that we can express amounts less than one whole.</p> <p>The word percentage comes from Latin and means 'out of 100'. They are the same as any fraction that has a denominator of 100.</p> <p>The first lesson helps you to understand what a percentage (%) is.</p> <p>The second lesson focusses on how percentages can be expressed as decimals and fractions.</p> <p>The third lesson is all about how to add decimals. When you do question 3, make sure you show all your working out.</p> <p>The final lesson is all about adding decimals with different amounts of decimal places. As long as you line up your decimal points, you'll do brilliantly.</p>	<p>PSHE</p> <p>Illustrate / add colour to your poster of your chosen black role model. Take your time producing a neat final version.</p> <p>Art</p> <p>Design your own Black Lives Matter themed poster and proudly display it in your window. You do not have to use this slogan, you can think of your own. I've placed a photo I found on the Newsround website of a recent protest (below this grid). Many of the slogans like 'Racism Is A Pandemic Too' are very powerful.</p> <p>My one would probably say:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Remove All Public Statues Of Racists</p> <p>I don't like to see people who acted terribly to any ethnic minority having statues celebrating their lives.</p>	<p>Walking and Cycling</p> <p>Go with an adult on a bike ride (keep to safe cycle routes) or go on a walk to somewhere new.</p> <p>Use the link below to help you to plan your route.</p> <p>https://www.brighton-hove.gov.uk/content/parking-and-travel/travel-transport-and-road-safety/cycling-and-walking</p> <p>I used this map to help me find a new way to get to school and I also used it to help me to walk to Rottingdean!</p> <p>Yoga</p> <p>Yoga is one of the most relaxing and effective types of physical exercise you can do. <p>However, please feel completely free to choose your own hero. If I didn't want to write about Muhammad Ali, I'd write about one of my favourite musicians (Prince or Aretha Franklin). If I wanted to write about a more modern role model, I'd maybe choose a sports star like Raheem Sterling or Amber Anning. If you are choosing your own role model, make sure you set aside time to research lots about your hero.</p> <p>Organise your writing into sections using subheadings. You can choose these. If I were writing about Muhammad Ali, I'd choose:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Childhood • Success as a Boxer • Why Did He Change His Name? • How He Stood Up For His Beliefs • Life After Retirement <p>Aim to write at least 4 sentences under each heading; I'm sure many of you will write more though. Please email a photo or electronic copy of your work.</p> <p>See if you can use colons and bullet points in some of your writing. We used the basic recipe above and added things we liked to it to give it our own twist. We added milk chocolate, white chocolate and raisins.
