PE AT ST BARTHOLOMEW'S

At St Bartholomew's we believe that all children should experience regular high quality PE and sports activities, as this helps to promote self-confidence, social inclusion and a healthy lifestyle. These qualities enhance children's learning, both in and out of the classroom. We are committed to ensuring that in addition to their regular PE and sports activities, children are educated about healthy lifestyles and have opportunities to try out different sports, be coached by trained coaches and take part in competitions.

The school provides a minimum of two PE sessions every week, as well as offering some after school health and fitness activities for many age groups, which increases pupil participation in sporting activities.

WHAT IS THE PE AND SCHOOL SPORT PREMIUM FUNDING?

In 2013-14 the Government launched its PE and Sport Funding. This funding is jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. Money goes directly to primary school head teachers, providing them with a dedicated resource to increase PE and school sports provision. Each school now receives £16,000 and £10 per pupil each year to be used solely on PE and sport.

The PE and Sports Premium Funding is targeted primarily at:

- professional development in the teaching of PE and sports for staff
- providing additional sporting opportunities, extra to the curriculum
- providing additional specialist teaching within the curriculum
- providing opportunities for pupils to enter competitions
- promoting a healthy lifestyle
