



PE Impact Report of Spending 2017-2018

Following the guidelines provided by the DFE, Forest Academy has chosen to invest the sports grant in the following key areas over the last academic year.

- The school was awarded the Silver Sports Mark, Summer 2018
- Provide a broad, challenging and engaging PE curriculum for all children
- Continue to promote new sports and increase participation.
- Develop partnerships with other schools and local sports clubs so that children will be inspired to take up sports.
- Enter the school into district partnership competitions and festivals
- Increase the confidence, subject knowledge and skills of teaching staff
- Achieve gender equality in all sports and activities

Impact of Spending Areas

P.E. Equipment

Due to a large amount of the PE budget being spent on equipment the previous year, not as much was needed to be spent in this area during this academic year. Only a few basic items were needed for example an additional assortment of balls to deliver REAL PE and goals to encourage physical activity at playtime.

Sports Coaches (Training and Teaching)

Throughout the academic year, sports coaches have assisted teachers in the delivery of dance, cricket, multisport, athletics, hockey and football. These coaches have not only provided on the job training for teachers, but have also allowed for quality lessons to be taught. This has led to increased participation from pupils, due to the engaging lesson content. Having received this on the job training, teachers have applied the knowledge they have gained into other areas of the curriculum and have been able to practice skill teaching alongside coaches.

The spending of money in this area has been very worthwhile as the confidence, subject knowledge and skills of our teachers has improved, allowing them to team teach within the sessions taught by the coaches. Also, the curriculum has become more engaging and as a result we have seen children take up sports in these areas outside of school, promoting healthy, active lifestyles. The knowledge brought in from these coaches has also shown us how to engage both genders, especially in the sports that are perceived as being either male or female dominant. (Some of the spending also went towards after school clubs).

Curriculum enhancement (Staff Training)

This year the school has continued to find ways to enhance the curriculum it provides. Additional courses have run throughout the year to enable pupils to extend their skills and develop life long skills, which will benefit them in the future. Balanceability, Bikeability and a Sports Leader workshop were courses made available.

<p>After school Clubs + extra opportunities Partnerships with local clubs have seen children take up sports outside of school. This year we have maintained Brandon School of Dance, who has also been paid to run after school clubs. These clubs have further developed the skills of children from Forest Academy, whilst continuing to provide physical activity. A strong partnership has developed particularly with the Brandon School of Dance, with many of their attendees coming from our school. The school also established a new partnership this year with another sports coach supplier, who not only train staff but also deliver after school clubs in a variety of sports. The total spending in this area was £1,445 (Some of the spending from sport coaches was for clubs, but inclusive of the overall package we brought into.) In addition, some spending was used to transport children to competitions, thus allowing the school to maximize its participation in locally run competitions.</p>	<p>£1,649</p>
<p>Forest Heath Sports Partnership This membership has enabled full access to the district’s competitive timetable. This academic year we entered many different competitions and festivals, including events throughout the whole age range of the school and for a wide range of abilities. The competitions entered consisted of swimming, football, hockey, basketball, tag rugby, rounders, table tennis and orienteering. In all events, opportunity was given for both boys and girls to take part, allowing for equal opportunity and promoting sport amongst girls and boys alike. The partnership has also allowed the school to receive support in the delivery of PE and given to school access to courses run locally by the partnership or in conjunction with it.</p>	<p>£1,045</p>

<p>Future Spending Future allocations will be used to maintain a high profile for PE and to increase physical activity. With the current school development taking place, transitioning to a two-form entry, future spending will be required to provide outside equipment/play areas to promote physical activity during break and lunch times. In addition, the school will buy into a local partnership, offering support and further opportunities to train staff and develop the children of Forest Academy. A percentage of the money allocated will be used next year for coaching, providing expertise in different areas of PE. Also, it will be necessary to use part of the budget to further enhance the PE equipment in school, allowing us to deliver PE more effectively within the school and provide further provision for after school clubs.</p>
