



Totally Terrific Toys - Homework Tasks



Geography:

Find out about toys from around the world. Use a world map to cut and stick or draw pictures of the toys played with in different countries around the world.

History:

Talk to your mums and dads and grans and grandads about the kind of toys they used to play with when they were children. Think about how they are different to the types of toys we play with today. Can you create an informative poster about a toy you learned about?

English:

Research information about one of your favourite toys. When was it invented? How has it changed over the years?

Create a factfile to teach your friends about your favourite toy.

Design & Technology:

Make a puppet! This could be using a wooden spoon or a sock. What will you make? Perhaps a doll, a dinosaur or a monster? Think about the resources you can use to make their eyes and mouths etc. We can use them to create our own puppet show!

Maths:

Cut out different shapes to create a picture of a toy. For example, triangles to make a kite, squares and triangles to make a rocket or circles and ovals to make a teddy bear. What design can you make? Stick your shapes onto paper to display it!

PSHE:

Happy New Year! Do you have a new year resolution? Think about something you would like to get better at, or a new skill you would like to learn. This could be learning skills, such as handwriting, or personal skills, such as dancing or swimming. Write your resolution on a balloon and how you will aim to achieve it over the year.
