Areas we need to develop

These are the areas, which have not scored as highly as others. This is our response to those concerns, highlighting what we already do to address each area.

My child is encouraged to work hard and do their best

All the children in our school are always expected to work hard. When I walk around our school I witness our children, in all year groups, demonstrating their good behaviours for learning. They engage in classroom discussions, when working independently they concentrate their work, they ask adults in the classroom for support and work well together. If you feel your child is capable of more, please come and talk to the class teacher.

My child receives an appropriate amount of homework for his/her age

Homework is always a tricky issue. What some parents consider to be too much homework, other parents consider being not enough and, usually, the children consider any homework to be too much! Following last year's parent questionnaire, we invited all parents / carers to a meeting to discuss the homework the children receive to see if we can find a solution which pleases everyone. At this meeting we discussed different possibilities for homework. The policy we now follow was agreed at that meeting. If you would like to discuss homework further, please arrange to see me.

The school communicates with me effectively about my child's progress

We have parents' evening during both the Autumn and Spring terms. At parents' evening, you receive a slip which details what your child can do, how we are helping at school and how you can help at home. In the end of your report, which you receive in the summer term you are also told where your child is in relation to age related expectations. If you would like more information, please speak to your class teacher. We have an open door policy and are always available.
