## Homework Leaflet Meadow Class Autumn Term 2018

### **Homework For The Meadow Class**

We would like children to reinforce basic skills at home for approximately 30 minutes per session eg 15 minutes reading; 10 minutes on spellings, and, 5 minutes on 'learn its'.

- Read at least 5 times on different days at home. Please can parents sign to confirm this. (Reading records to be shown each morning at school).
- Learn spellings 5 times per week (Woodland group tested on Monday mornings and Forest group on Wednesday mornings).
- Memorise a given times table (tested weekly).

In school, the children will be rewarded in the following ways:

- Reading - two reward points for each session recorded.
- Learn spellings - two reward points for all correct, one reward point for scoring more than their previous best score.
- Learn their multiplication facts - two reward points when they have memorised a times table in a mixed order.
