### Virtues -

This week's virtue is 'Integrity'.

### Foundation stage

This week during our Little Robins Forest school session the children will be decorating leaves that are egg-shaped with sequins etc. and Ephemeral art - Children make the first letter of their name using found objects. On Tuesday we have a veterinary nurse visiting and Alfie's dad on Wednesday who is a chef at Kota Kai .In the afternoon the children will continue to make hot cross buns with Mrs. Riding. We are revising our sounds with the Reception children and the Nursery are focusing on rhyme and showing their awareness of

sound. Joining in with action songs and Rhymes. In maths, we are halving objects and numbers using the part, part whole method.

### Key Stage 1

This week we will start looking at how to use an atlas and finding out about a place called Kampong Ayer. See what facts you can find out at home and share them with your teacher. In maths, we are looking at fractions. Again, look at every day shapes and see if you can halve or quarter them. There are only two weeks now for the children to achieve this term's reading target. Certificates will be given out next Thursday. We are looking forward to our trip to the church on Friday for the Easter service and hope you can join us.

### Key Stage 2

Year 3/4 have been working very hard on their Easter performance, ready for the service on Friday. In writing they have been concentrating on letter writing. This week, the children will be looking at the story of 'Beowulf' which fits in nicely with their topic of Anglo-Saxons.

In literacy, year 5/6 have been looking at their own writing and ensuring that they use formal language and a variety of sentence types. In maths, year 5 have been learning about decimals, percentages and fractions whilst year 6 learn about area, perimeter and ratio.
