Foundation stage

This week our focus keeping healthy and our teeth. On Friday we will have a visit from a dental Nursery and the Reception children will be writing and asking questions. In Maths we are focusing on one less reading stories, rhymes and eating our numicon biscuits which we will make with Mrs Riding on Monday.

Forest school activities involve looking for dragons on the field and making our own huge bubbles using hoops.

Key Stage 1

Last week the children all had a go at being weather forecasters. For the past week we have also been using a rain gauge to measure the daily amount of rain outside the school. In Science we analysed this data. The children were able to build graphs and write about their findings. During literacy the children have been learning about nouns and adjectives using examples from Spring to help them write their sentences. In Art the children have just started to look at famous artists and discuss how they represent different weather patterns. They are working towards painting their own weather pictures in the coming weeks.

Key Stage 2

Year 3/4 - This week, we have been building on our understanding of poetry and have been reading a variety of wind poems with super intonation! We have continued to use fractions when adding and subtracting and are now using compound and mixed fractions with growing confidence. We are going to be completing a 'science day' on the 9th and so the children will all be investigating something a little out of the ordinary! Letters went out this week for Coose Trannack Cross country race and further sports clubs. If you want further information on any of these, please speak to the class teacher. There were still a small number of children who do not have their PE kits in school. In the future, you will receive a text when your child has forgotten their kit, as the children tend to need it on at least 2 occasions during the week and they won't miss out on their second session.

Year 5/6 - The children were a credit to the school on Thursday when they sang 'Trelawney' in our village for St Piran's day. Kota Kai treated to the children after with a drink and a biscuit which was really appreciated by all the children. The children have been learning how and why a volcano erupts by watching videos and researching books in literacy. They have used their knowledge to plan detailed sentences to write an explanation text later this week. On Thursday, we are having a science day which will be full of fun and interesting activities.
