Specific Aims for 2019 / 2020

1. To continue to improve levels of activity in relation to the Active 30/30 agenda, ensuring physical activity and well being is embedded within the practices of all staff
2. Continue to work collaboratively with the cluster partnership to support and develop sport and healthy lifestyles in the community
3. Improve consistently in assessment, increasing the % children at ARE and GLD
4. Incorporate active outdoor learning activities into school curriculum each week
5. Staff continue to team teach alongside specialist coaches / teachers to increase confidence, skills and understanding
6. Provide appropriate CPD
7. Provide resources / equipment to support the development of physical activity

In addition, to fulfil its aims, the school also intends to:

1. Continue to provide access and opportunities for all children to participate in a range of after school PE / Sporting activities during the school year
2. Continue House Days and School Sports week to highlight and encourage sports within our curriculum
3. Continue to promote further sports and PE opportunities for both gifted and talented and SEND children
4. Develop the school environment to facilitate further provision for outdoor learning / activities
