Learning together to challenge and achieve

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding to cater for substantial school sport investment. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.

How will we be spending the Sports Funding and who will benefit?

We use our funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of physical education (PE), physical activity and sport.

This means that we will use the premium to:

Add to the PE, physical activity and sport activities by introducing more variety of sports and build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

We will also ensure:

The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.

The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.

To increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport through in-house training and CPD.

A broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils through a range of lunchtime and afterschool clubs.

An increased participation in competitive sport from KS1.

This year we are concentrating on the following:

Providing staff with professional development, mentoring, training and resources to help them teach PE and sport introducing new sports and other activities to encourage more pupils to take up sport and physical activities (such as Dance, fencing, Archery, Yoga etc)
Supporting and involving the least active children by providing targeted activities.
Entering and running more sport competitions in partnership with other schools.
Running sports activities and clubs (such as rugby, hockey, athletics, football, cross country, ballroom dancing, cricket and netball).
Encouraging pupils to take on leadership or volunteer roles that support sport and physical activity within the school raise attainment in primary school swimming to meet requirements of the national curriculum before the end of key stage 2. To support this we provide lessons for Years 5 children. Lessons will be taught by Suffolk Norse staff alongside our members of staff. This year (2018/19) 82% of the children were able to swim at least 25 meters.
We also aim to embed physical activity into the school day through active travel to and from school, active playgrounds and active teaching (Forest Schools / essential life skills)

The school is proud to offer a range of extra-curricular activities, accessed by children from Key Stages one and two. We are also please to boast an increase of participation from children from our Specialist Support Centre. These clubs will continue to run with no fee charged for sports clubs run by school staff who run them but if an outside provider is used then a small fee may be charged. Any children in receipt of pupil premium support are able to apply for funding to attend these additional clubs.
We offer a range of sports clubs, depending on the term. Clubs include football, netball, tag rugby, hockey, cricket and gymnastics, cross country, ballroom dancing, street dance and fencing and archery.

Providing opportunities for children to compete

Dale Hall Primary are proud members of **IPSSA** (Ipswich Primary School Sports Association) and the **Suffolk School Games**. Our membership allows us to compete in a range of sports and activities across the school year. We also have links with neighboring schools which has helped us to develop our teams in readiness for competitive participation. Last year *2017-18 we attended completed 15 NGB level 1 competitions and 14 level 2 competitions. We also attended 3 County finals and qualified for 5.*
To date for 2018-19 we have competed in 15 NGB level 1 competitions and 14 level 2 competitions. *We also attended 1 County final where we came 2nd.*

Professional Development

(Last year staff attended dance, gymnastics and tennis CPD run by Suffolk School Games)

Through being members of Suffolk School Games we are able to access a wide range of termly CPD (curriculum professional development) opportunities.

In addition to this the school have made links with outside agencies such as Ipswich Sports Club, Premiere Sport and Learn Play Grow. The school has made several visits to the sports club to make links in the community. Learn Play grow and Premier Sport offers after school sports activities and offer taster sessions to allow children to experience what these clubs are like.

As of September 2018 we will also offer an active breakfast club run by Premier Sport.

Chance to Shine Helped develop Year 4 cricket skills, with the charity supporting both the staff and pupils.
