

Odd Socks



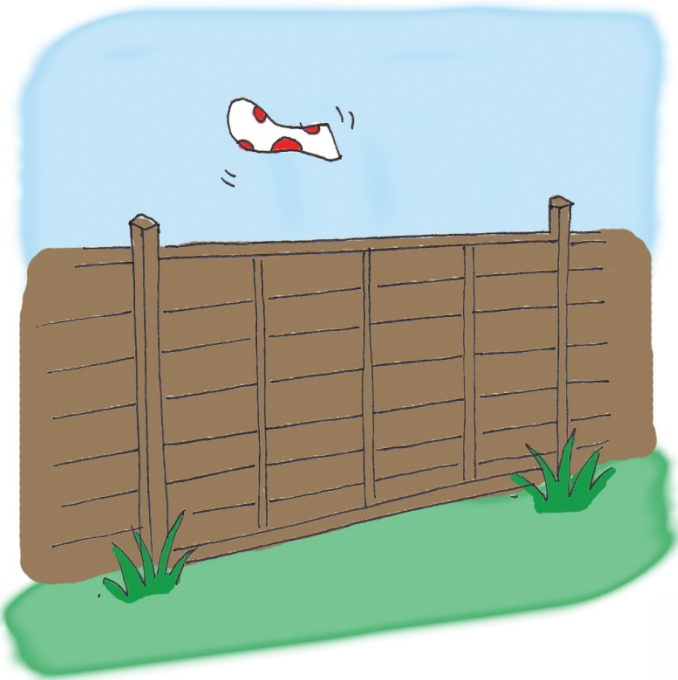
Dog washed his socks.

Dog's socks were hanging on the washing line to dry.



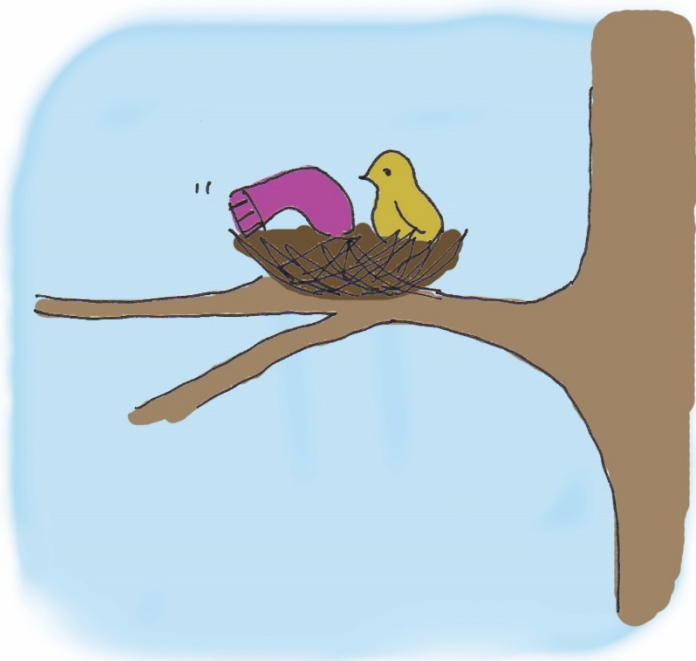


Dog lost some socks.

fence.

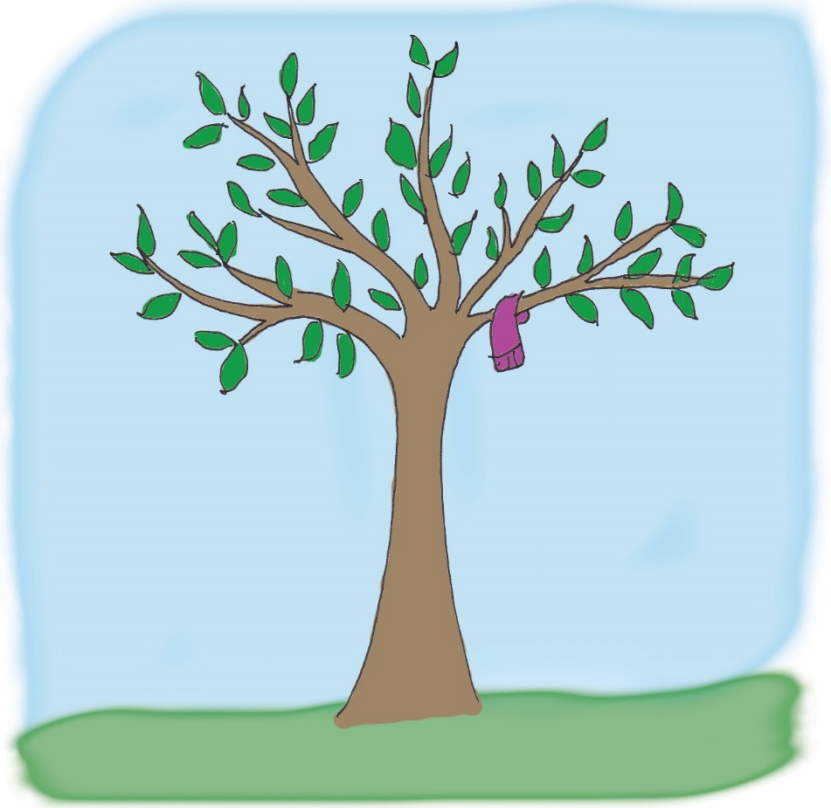
One was **stolen** by a
fox.



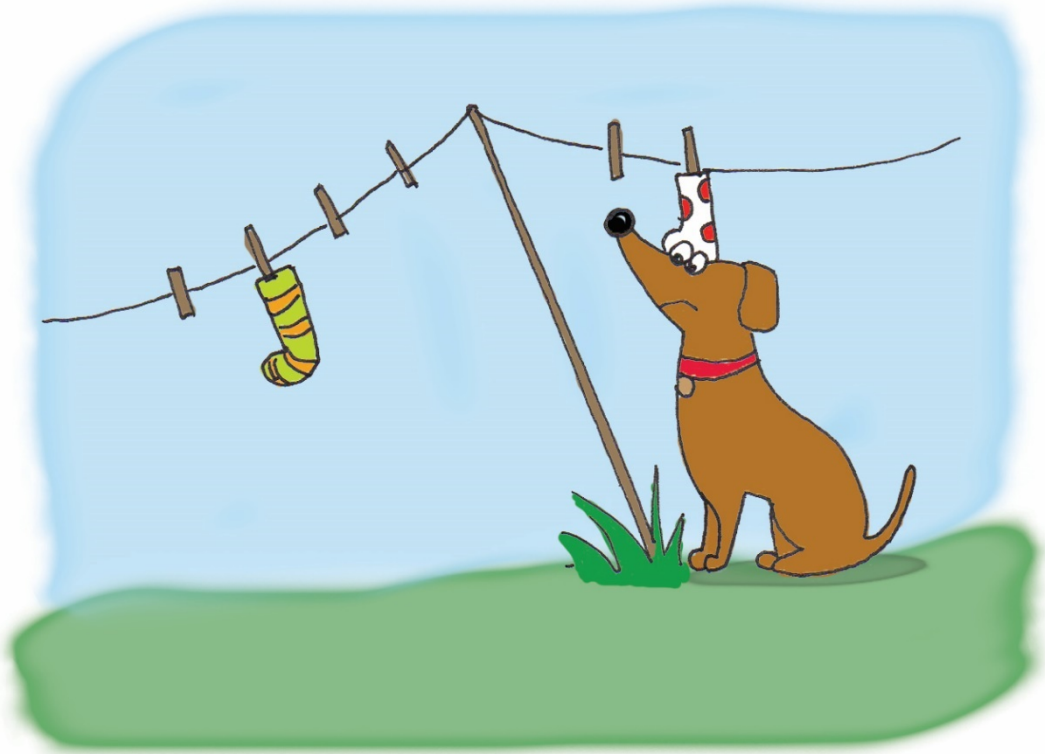
One went to **line** a

The fox stole one of Dog's socks.

How do you think one got over the fence?

The wind could have blown a sock over the fence. (Also accept children's own ideas if they make sense).

What did a bird do with one of the socks?

The bird made its nest all warm and cosy with a sock.

Do you think that Dog will find all of his socks? Why?

Encourage children to give reasons for their answers.
