Sam has a dog. His name is Rex.

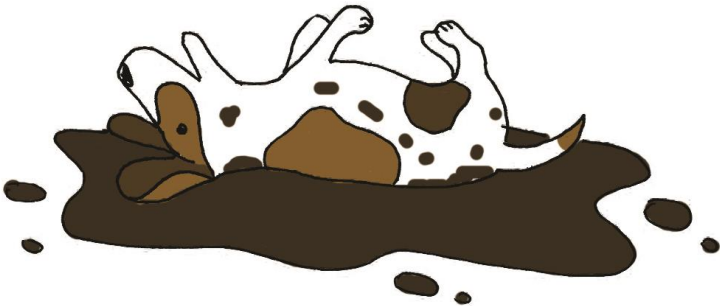

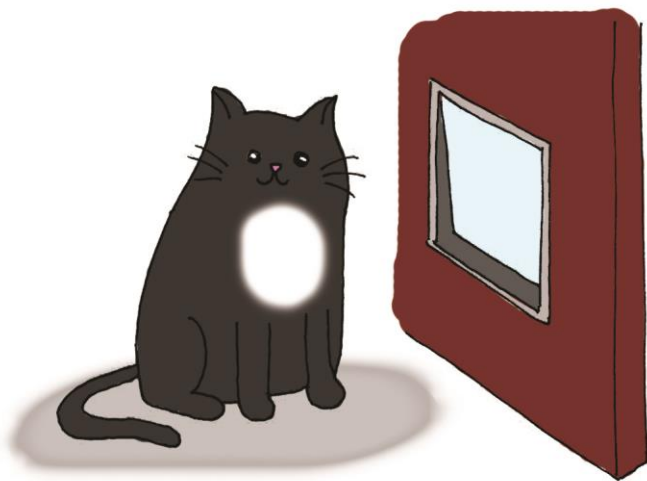
Sam's dog likes to roll in the mud. Tom's cat does not.



Tom's cat eats milk and fish. Sam's dog does not.



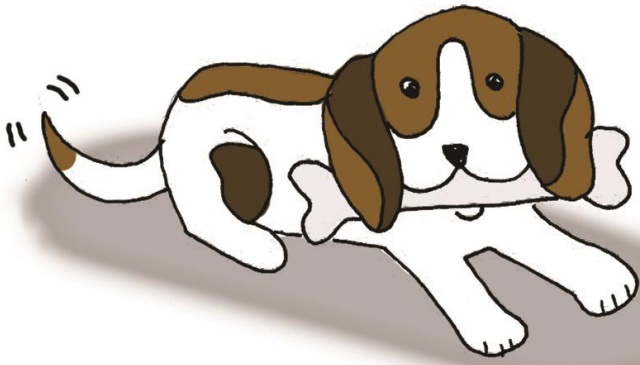
Sam's dog likes to fetch sticks. Tom's cat does not.



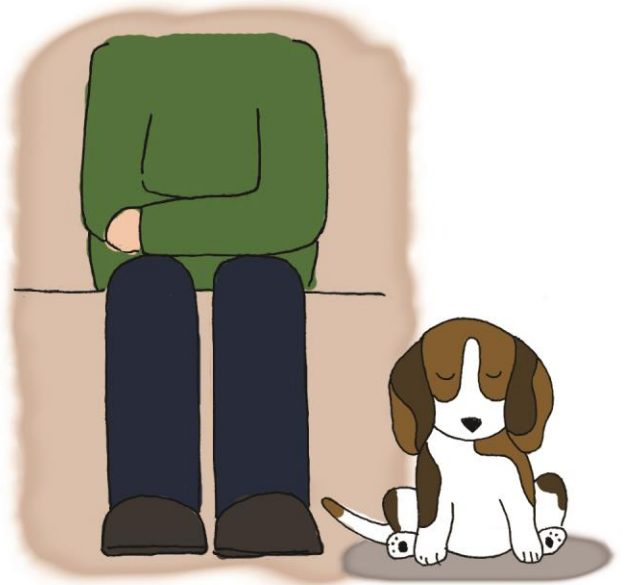
Tom's cat likes his cat flap. Sam's big dog does not.

## Dog and Cat – SPAG

What does 's mean after somebody's name?
