Next week we will begin looking at fractions such as halves and quarters nearer the end of the week. In literacy we have concluded our learning about the story of Beegu by writing postcards from her and creating character descriptions and will begin non-fiction writing next week. We have explored who Neil Armstrong is and what made him significant and have utilized the amazing weather by using our outdoor learning space to create meals for Alan the alien in the mud kitchen, chalking pictures and sentences on the ground and exploring the different textures of materials we could find.
