Class news - what's happening

Kynance:

Another great week for Kynance! We have thoroughly enjoyed spending lots of time outside - especially building obstacle courses! We have started our phonics this week, so we are learning lots of new sounds. Our new class book is 'The Paper Dolls'. We are spending lots of time learning how to share and the importance being kind and staying safe. Next week, we will be learning to identify numbers one to five. In phonics, we will be focusing on forming our first Set 1 sounds. Miss Guy, Miss Jasper and Miss Russell are so proud of how well we are coming in each morning independently!

Gwithian:

Next week Gwithian class will be continuing to focus on positive behaviours of superheroes, linking them to our own behaviour and thinking about whether there are ways we could improve our own behaviour to be more positive. We will be looking at numbers, comparing which are bigger and smaller, more and less, what this means and how we can show this. In literacy, we will be focusing on poetry, alliteration in particular, by studying the poem 'Fern' from The Lost Words book. We will continue the focus of this book and the poem 'Fern' into our other curriculum areas such as movement in PE, and creative art work in Art and Design.

Sennen:

This week Sennen have worked hard to learn about what makes plants grow well by following instructions and making predictions. In Maths they have been looking at odd and even numbers - keep practising these at home! In English, The Little Red Hen gave us some instructions on how to make bread and we retold the story. Next week we are looking forward to learning poems from The Lost Words and visiting The Eden Project! A reminder that we need the money-£6.50 by Monday please.

Fistral:

This week Fistral have had a fantastic week! We have been busy baking bread, writing a recipe for our own flavoured bread roll in English and spent lots of time learning about greater and less than in maths. Next week we will be off topic focussing on the book 'Lost Words' alongside the rest of the school. In English, we will be looking at Kennings and other forms of poetry, while in the afternoons we will be outdoors exploring the natural environment around our school - reclaiming some of those lost words. Our outdoor learning could be messy so please make sure your child has a change of clothes, a coat and wellies with them every day. In maths, we will be moving on to addition and subtraction with 3 digit numbers. Do not forget Fistral class have started swimming, those children with names in the first 4 letters of the alphabet need to bring swimming kit with them on Tuesday.

Pentire:

Next week sees Pentire class take a break from the Demon Dentist and our topic work as we focus on activities linked to the whole school poetry week. We will be exploring a range of poetry forms and styles and completing Art, Drama and ICT tasks linked to the poems. Maths lessons will continue as normal.

Marazion:

Next week in Marazion class, we will be basing our learning around 'The Lost Words' poetry book. In maths, we will be focusing on place value; rounding numbers to 1,000,000 and negative numbers. During the afternoon session, we will be designing and creating bird sculptures linked to the 'The Lost Words'.
