

Welcome to the Spring Term at Bream. Last term saw many changes here at Bream and going forward there are lots more planned. As a school, we have also been working on our ethos and for children, there has been a lot of talk about how we treat each other and wish to be treated. There are additional members of staff out on the playground at break time and lunchtime monitoring behaviour and stepping in when appropriate to do so. Consequently, the children are enjoying their free time and with the additional activities planned, this should continue to develop. If you do have any concerns however, please do come into school to see me.

During the Spring Term there are several whole school activities planned that will engage and excite your children. It is our wish to involve you in the school as much as possible and thank you to everyone who has supported us during the Autumn Term.

The following applies in the event that Bream School needs to close:

Information about a school closure is communicated to the Local Authority for inclusion on their website (www.glosclosedschools.com) and the area radio stations immediately. The same information is relayed to all those parents/carers via the text messaging service immediately afterwards. This will also be on our Facebook page.

Information is also posted on the school website (www.breamcofeprimary.co.uk) as soon as we can clarify details of the situation. More detailed information will be supplied by text message as soon as it is available.

A closure during the school day will be communicated by text message and no child will be allowed to walk home without parental permission.

It is very helpful to us when parents/carers keep each other informed as we have no guarantee of 100% coverage with the text message service.
