

LITERACY

As writers, the children will be given the opportunity to write in a variety of genre in both fiction and non-fiction. This will include narrative and non-chronological reports.

Alongside this children will continue to learn comprehension and grammar skills. All of these skills will be consolidated and embedded throughout the curriculum.

SCIENCE

The children will be investigating space, including the causes of day and night, the four seasons and the eclipses of the sun and moon. The children will continue to develop their knowledge and understanding of predictions and conclusions. They will also record their observations in a variety of ways. Furthermore, they will also develop their working scientifically skills through enquiries.

COMPUTING

The children will be collecting data about the planets in our solar system to create some Top Trump cards initially, followed by a database of information. They will then use this data to compare and contrast information. They will continue working with Scratch online, thinking about how to give positive feedback on existing projects and the consequences of misusing the program.

MATHEMATICS

As mathematicians, children will be looking at addition and subtraction, using written methods for numbers over 4 digits and applying these in different situations. They will use rounding to estimate and approximate as well as using the inverse to check their calculations. We will then look at statistics, interpreting charts and line graphs and gathering data from timetables.

THEME:

'Take One Book'

ART/DT

In DT, the children will be continuing with textiles, looking at planning and creating designs using sewing techniques.

PSHE

The theme for PSHE this term is celebrating differences. We will be looking at how everyone is different and the issues that can arise such as bullying and racism.
