Maths Inter Rail

Thank you for all of your support with our new Inter Rail targets. The children have been working so hard and have been making excellent progress!

As a school we recognise that problem solving and reasoning are as fundamental as the rapid recall of facts to the development of mathematical ability. Therefore, from next term we will be integrating the two.

R – Y3 children will continue working on the Inter Rail targets up to Copenhagen (end of Y4 target). Therefore, the changes will mainly affect Y4, 5 and 6 as once the children have completed the Inter Rail targets linked to their year group they will spend Inter Rail lesson time solving a range of problems (linked to their Year Group objectives) using Doodle Maths, N-Rich problems and SATS paper type questions.

However, when all the children join the next Year group in September the train will return to the station and they start the next journey on the Inter Rail targets for that year group (even if they have previously covered these objectives), this is because the need for constant revision is evident through the Curriculum; once they have succeeded with the year group targets (Y4, 5 and 6) they will move back on to the problem solving content whilst R, Y1, 2 and 3 will continue up to Copenhagen before working on problem solving activities.

Once the children have exceeded their Year group targets we would like them to either complete Doodle Maths for their set homework task or improve their times table speed using the BBC multiplication grid (which can be found online) or use a timer to time and improve their calculations. These activities can be logged in the WOW book in order to continue to earn Calton Credits.


Thank you for your continued hard work. I am sure that you will have as much fun working through the targets and problem solving activities as we will!
