

Over the last two weeks, Year 6 have been engaging in lots of exciting activities. We have come back from half term refreshed and ready for the build up to Christmas.

In maths, we have moved from the main operations on to fractions. We have begun to simplify fractions, as well as counting with them. We are beginning to form a firm understanding of these, as we move on to using the 4 operations along with fractions.
