Children's Engagement in All School Has to Offer

We have, for some time now, been witnessing a significant shift in our children's engagement in their daily learning and with the opportunities on offer. As teachers we are certainly aware of this and, we have sensed this change, but it can be difficult to really understand the magnitude of this shift. As a head teacher, I too am aware of it and proud of it, but once again it can be difficult to judge until you see comparisons with other schools.

In recent weeks we have had other head teachers from Crofty schools examining the work we do. I have been in schools in Truro and in Crofty in my School Improvement role and Governors have been in school carrying out their monitoring responsibilities. What is quite evident is that our children are very engaged in their lessons and by that, I mean that they listen carefully to their teachers, they settle to their work enthusiastically, show resilience when learning gets 'hard' and are confident in being able to use the resources around the classroom to help them with their work (and not immediately seek adult help). They work confidently with their peers and have a growing vocabulary to help them explain their work and they reflect upon their learning quite naturally now and, therefore, are thinking ahead about what they need to do to get better.

The shift in their growth as young people is also evident in their behaviour around the school. There will always be the occasional 'blip' on the playground where children have not made the best choices and these situations are used as learning opportunities but the general behaviour is incredible. Children are empathetic, reflective, kind, thoughtful, solve conflicts, and are organisers. They are responsible and respectful and relationships between children and the relationships between children and adults are very healthy.

The shift in our children's attitudes and outlook, can also be marked by the numbers of children who are so keen to take part in clubs and teams and events outside of school. We have never had so many children taking part in clubs and those children are turning out so regularly now and clearly benefiting from these opportunities. An example of this is the fact that there are two clubs that take place on a Friday night and involve 45 children and the attendance each and every week is amazing. The popularity of netball has grown so much that we have now scheduled two evenings to cater for the numbers. Similarly, the numbers of children wanting to take part in cross country is simply great and the success we had at the recent Redruth Cross Country has been the best yet.

All of this does not happen overnight and, it is not down to one person, or to one approach, but it is the efforts from the whole school community that has helped raise children's aspirations and, as a result, we have children who see themselves as learners with the resourcefulness to overcome challenges in their learning and, the inbuilt resources, to be able to shape their future, regardless of the challenges that are thrown at them. Staff at the school work incredibly hard and have an amazing determination to deliver and the partnership that exists now between parents and teachers is clearly having a huge impact but, what is also a huge factor in this shift, is the fact that our parent body are echoing those aspirational messages at home.

Thank you and let's keep it going.
