Dear Parents/Carers,

I am writing to you to inform you that at our recent Trinity Federation governors meeting, governors voted unanimously to dissolve the Trinity Federation with effect from 31st August 2019.


The reason for this is that, from 1st September 2019 All Saints School, Bednall and St Leonard's School, Dunston will join Staffordshire University Academy Trust (SUAT). St Michael's School will revert to being a maintained Church of England School with its own governing board. All Saints and St Leonard's will still be known informally as the Trinity Federation.

All Saints and St Leonard's will be the responsibility of SUAT but will have one Local Academy Council (LAC) with delegated responsibilities from SUAT. This will be an exciting time for both schools and I am sure that there will be great benefits for both schools by being part of SUAT and at the same time maintaining their own individual characters. I have agreed to chair the LAC for one year only before standing down from the committee.

On behalf of all governors of the Federation. I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your continuing support of All Saints School. I know that the last 15 months or so have been worrying ones for many of you and we do thank you for your patience and for your support for Mrs Parton and all that she is doing as Executive Headteacher.

Class 3's Crime Scene Investigation



Class 3 became members of the CSI and carried out an investigation on the school playground where many suspicious bodies were found!

The investigation required the use of the children's newly acquired measurement and conversion skills in order to get to the bottom of mystery!



On arrival at the scene, the children had to measure body outlines at its tallest and widest points to try and help identify them! They recorded this measurement in centimetres before converting into metres. Some of them even thought about how we could find their heights in kilometres – although agreed this wouldn't be sensible unless they were measuring the body of a giant!



Finally, the children had to choose a suitable unit and piece of measuring equipment to work out the body's location in relation to nearby surroundings! Many of the deaths appear to have been caused by accidents involving playground equipment!

This week we were introduced to our new value in church, we heard definitions of what respect is and heard a story. Mr Bales also came into Class 3 and told the story of 'The Good Samaritan' with a modern twist teaching us about respect. Elections



All Saints Junior Governor Elections

Next half term we will be teaching the children at All Saints about the role of Parliament, MP's and how elections work.

We will also be finding out about the **core British Values that we promote. Our annual 'mock' elections** will begin on the **20th June**. Your children are divided into four house teams across the school and we are looking for candidates from Year 4 or 5 to represent their house team and the British value that their house team has chosen. On **Thursday 20th June** the candidates will have chance to present their manifesto to their house teams and a 'Local election' will take place. The elected person will become their house teams Junior Governor. They will then work with their house team to fully develop their manifesto in the hope that their team will become the elected house team in our 'general elections' through a secret ballot and the Junior **governor will receive the title of 'Prime Junior Governor' for our school. The general election will** take place on **Friday 21st June**. The British value that house team is representing will then be focused on throughout the school year in a range of different ways.



If your child would like to put themselves forwards to be a Junior Governor they must be in Year 4 or 5 and will need to prepare their manifesto (in the form of a rap/poem/song or speech) over half term ready for **Thursday 20th June**, stating why they feel they can do a good job, what qualities they have and how they will help take our school forward. We will publish the election results in the newsletter that week.
