

St Joseph's Catholic Primary School
Foundation Stage – Spring term (2nd half)



It was lovely to see the happy smiles of the children as they returned to school after the Half Term holiday.

This term we continue with our topic called 'Ei Ei Dough.' We have really been enjoying this farm theme and have now developed the Hub area into a tractor and farm shop.

Our Literacy has been linked to this topic using the story of 'The Little Red Hen.' Which we have enjoyed learning to 'read/tell' the story (with actions), writing labels, creating lists etc. The Oak children have been writing the story and were very imaginative when we were inventing our own version of the story. We shall continue our topic with the introduction of a new story called Farmer Duck by Martin Waddell and Helen Oxenbury.

In Mathematics we will continue with number recognition, develop counting skills, early addition and subtraction skills using numbers up to 20. We will also work within the area of shape, space and measures (including work on length, time and money). This will mainly be explored through practical activities and also across our curriculum and environment. E.g. using the role play area.

For Creative development, as well as the roleplay and imaginative play, we will also be using different materials and media with which to explore colour, texture and design.

We will also continue to be physically active with our outdoor play, using bikes and trikes, obstacle courses, developing our throwing and catching skills, P.E sessions as well as movement and music.

Our Funky fingers sessions will continue to introduce the cursive writing style for those children that are ready as well as the fine motor activities from tweezers to pegs and threading beads/cheerio's onto different strings. Dough discos will continue to be a regular feature in our learning!

Our topics for Religious Education will be Judaism, Lent and Holy Week.

We are also planning to go on a visit to a farm.

We encourage the children to feel proud when they can achieve things by themselves. This includes taking responsibility for their own possessions. We have established routines whereby children are able to ensure snack pots, water bottles and book bags find their place in the classroom.

Grown-ups can help by encouraging children to put on their clothes, coats and shoes by themselves and by helping them to eat independently at meal times.

Oak Class home learning	Friday	Wednesday	Weekly
Reading 	<p>Oak children will continue to choose three books each week that should be spread out over the week. This should include – reading, re-reading, discussing and retelling.</p> <p>Please ensure you write in the yellow reading record book to let us know your comments from home.</p> <p>Get them reading! We suggest you to read at least 3 times per week for 10 minutes at a time. Encourage your child to ‘sound it out’ and help them ‘blend’ the sounds together by repeating the sounds back to them. Practise really does make perfect!</p> <p>Get them writing! Encourage your child to write independently using their growing phonic skills. They could write shopping lists, cards, post-its, notes, messages, letters, little books and postcards – anything at all. It’s all great practise.</p>		

Reminders:

School lunch PLEASE  NO PEANUTS OR NUT PRODUCTS	<p>Oak children are entitled to a free school lunch every day. Please select your menu choices in advance. You can do up to half a term at a time!</p> <p>For Acorn children a school lunch can be ordered at a cost of £2.35 School dinners must be ordered on Parent pay before 8am.</p> <p>We promote healthy eating at school and so lunch boxes should not contain more than one chocolate snack and one packet of crisps.</p> <p>Children are welcome to bring fresh fruit or vegetables for a snack at break time. We are a nut free school. We have children with potentially fatal nut allergies in school, therefore no food containing nuts may be sent into school.</p>
Drinks	Your child must have a named water bottle in school every day. Please only send in water, no juice or fizzy is allowed.
Uniform	<p>Please ensure all uniform is clearly named.</p> <p>Grey trousers or shorts, grey skirt or pinafore dress, Black, white or grey socks, grey tights, White polo shirt, Green logo school sweatshirt or cardigan. Warm weather option – green and white gingham dress (dress with shorts instead of skirt is acceptable)</p> <p>Hair past shoulder length must be tied back – please use plain hairbands in green, black or white, not brightly coloured bows.</p> <p>Nail varnish is not allowed.</p> <p>School shoes must be black and no heels, trainers or boots.</p>
PE kit (Oak class only)	<p>Green t-shirt with school logo, black shorts, jogging bottoms and trainers. All kit must be named and in a named bag.</p> <p>Ear rings must be removed or covered with tape for PE lessons.</p> <p>Watches must be removed for PE.</p> <p>PE kit must be in school every day.</p>
Wellies 	Please ensure your child has a pair of clearly named wellie boots that can be kept in school this will enable the children to explore outside without getting their school shoes muddy!
Bags	<p>Reception, Yr 1 and 2 children must have a book bag in school. This is so books can easily be checked and letters put in.</p> <p>Children can have a bag or rucksack in school but please avoid the large bulky ones as 30 rucksacks take up a lot of room in the class.</p>
Mornings	Our Foundation Stage doors are open from around 8:45am. Please pass on any

	<p>quick messages then, for a longer meeting please make an appointment. When you arrive in the morning please support your child with sorting their belongings and then settle your child to an activity. The tambourine rings at 9:05am for us to begin our hello circle.</p> <p>Children and parents arriving after 9.00am will be asked to sign in at the office.</p>
After school	<p>Acorn (Nursery) children finish at 3:15pm and Oak (Reception) children finish at 3.30pm. If someone other than yourself is collecting your child please ensure the office has their details. We will not let them leave unless we are sure they are safe.</p> <p>Acorn parents- Please ensure you are on time at 3:15pm as staff have to move through to the Oak room and get things sorted for the After School Club that takes place in the Acorn classroom.</p>
