SALISBURY NURSERY 2020

We are delighted to offer all our nursery pupils, a 30 hours nursery place. This offer does of course have cost implications.

Some of our nursery families will be eligible to apply for the Nursery Education Grant and others may decide to take a full time place and buy additional hours.

We are open 8.45-3.15pm = 32.5 hours a week, term time only, 38 weeks per year. Salisbury Primary School's Nursery can offer your child a nursery place in the following ways:

Your child will have their core entitlement of 15 hours.

The school will run a lunch club for your child to stay for lunch between 11.45am-12.15pm. This is at a cost of £3 per day - £15 per week even if you are eligible for the free place. Children can bring a packed lunch or purchase a school dinner ordered at the office.

You can opt for your child to have a full-time place, extending their hours by arriving at 8.45am, staying for lunch club and the afternoon session – finishing at 3.15pm.

The additional hours on top of the 15 hours core entitlement, can be bought in 3 hour blocks – for £5 per hour, totalling £15 per day OR they can be funded through the Government's Nursery Education Grant (NEG) also known as the 30 Hour Free Childcare Scheme.

Salisbury Primary School also works in partnership with other providers on the 30 Hour Scheme e.g. childminders and we are happy to share the 30 hours entitlement with them.

If you are eligible for the Nursery Education Grant, you do not have to take all of the additional 15 hours, but if you want to use less sessions these must be in 3 hour blocks.

To get 30 hours free childcare, you'll need to do the following:

- If you are eligible, you will receive a code – this will allow you to arrange your childcare place ahead of September 2020.

Take your code to your childcare provider (Salisbury Primary School), along with your National Insurance number and your child's date of birth.

- Salisbury Primary will check the code is authentic and allocate your child a free childcare place.
- You will then need to confirm that you continue to be eligible every 3 months by logging back on to the website. Salisbury will write to you at the end of each term to update our system with your new code. If you cease to be eligible for the NEG then you may choose to fund the additional hours or revert to a part-time place.
